## **ABOUT SEUIL**

Seuil is a recognised charity whose mission is to guide 14-18 year-olds in socially difficult situations, to become key decision-makers in their own reinsertion, by undertaking a custom-designed, remote, habit-breaking walk of 1800 km, lasting about one hundred days in a foreign country. More than thirty teenagers now undertake this educational project every year. More than 200 teenagers in total have completed such a walk with Seuil.

### **ABOUT THE EUROPEAN BA NETWORK PROJECT**

Seuil participates with four other European partners from Germany, Belgium and Italy in the "Between Age: Network for young offenders and NEETs" project, whose aim is to exchange best practices between partners and to organise public events.

The project is triennial (2015-2018).
