I know it seems we only had an APCM recently and that's because we did.

Due to COVID we postponed the APCM to October 20 but traditionally we have to hold the APCM April time and so the date for the APCM this year will be Wednesday 21 April 21 at 7pm in the Church.

At the APCM we elect Church Wardens and PCC members.

In St Mary's we operate the 3 year rule which means tenure is 3 years at which point you come off the PCC but you can be voted back on if you wish to stand again. This means we will have potentially 4 vacancies

If you are interested in standing for PCC you must be on the electoral roll and you must find someone to propose and second you and these people must also be on the electoral roll.

There will be forms available in Church for you to complete but exceptionally and for this year only. you can also email me but you must include your full name and address and the full names and addresses of your proposer and seconder. If you have any questions about this please email me.

Re the Electoral Roll this is not an update year so if you are already on the roll you do not need to complete a new form. If you wish to join please let me know-you have to be a regular attender and/or live in the parish to qualify.If you are not sure if you are already on the roll just email me and I will check.

Finally, due to COVID there will be limited places available for the APCM so you must let me know if you are planning to attend

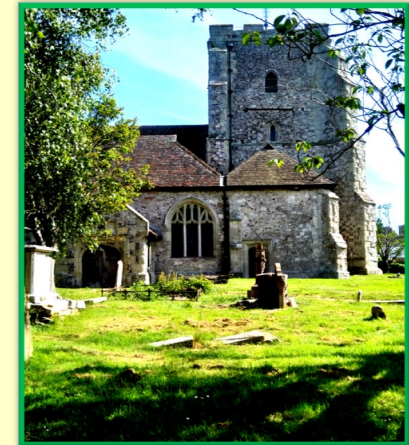

If stones could talk

For almost a thousand years I have been standing in the village of Westham . My walls are strong, my pillars are stalwart, my windows are beautiful. The bells ring out from my tower with a call to worship and prayer. I am a centre of peace and quiet, and have been throughout the centuries. I am your village church. I am here for the people of Westham and have been a sanctuary during many hard times.
