Richard is asked regularly to provide media comment or interviews on issues concerning economic policy and governance and public-sector reform. His specific expertise lies in the area of taxation policy, public finance and business regulation at the domestic and international/global levels.

Andrew Wilkie has been the Independent Member for Denison since 2010. In this time he has been active on a range of policy areas, including gambling reform, animal welfare, asylum seekers, climate change, and foreign and security policy. Before becoming an MP Andrew was a lieutenant colonel in the Australian Army, ran a small business in Hobart and worked as an intelligence analyst at the Office of National Assessments, where he resigned in 2003 in protest over the Iraq War. He has served on the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Intelligence and Security and as the chair of the Parliamentary Joint Select Committee on Gambling Reform.
