Christchurch Snipers went through their 8 games at the National Champs undefeated and treated the crowds to top class displays of inline hockey on their way to the National Open Division 1 (Premier) title. The Snipers featured a number of players who have represented NZ at World Champs level and also included outstanding U18 Redbacks 5-3. players, Sam Petrie and Ryan Ruddle, and promising goalies Matt Sandford and Oliver Roberts. In the final Snipers and U16 titles all going to the New defeated Auckland Storm 7 - 3.
