New Zealand takes Silver Medal in Passau, Germany



Team New Zealand, captained by Devon Kay and coached by Shane Clark, took <u>SILVER</u> honours in a "nail-biting" finish in the final game of Division 1 at the IIHF Inline Hockey World Championships. At full time the game was drawn 4 all with Brazil. The Brazilian team scored the sudden death goal taking the gold medal in the 5th minute of overtime.

Earlier in the world championship event the NZ team met Hungary in their first game winning 9-8. The team suffered losses against Brazil (5-3) and Australia (13-2), however the team re-grouped and moved onto Japan (Pool C) winning 5-4 putting them into the semi final where they met the Aussie team once again. This time, however our arch-rivals, Australia went down 7-3 to the victorious kiwi team giving them a place in the gold medal final against Brazil. The second placing in Division 1, is the highest placing a New Zealand team has achieved at the IIHF Inline Hockey World Championships. In 2002 the New Zealand team were placed third, the event was held in Plaffenhoffen, Germany. CONGRATULATIONS to all NZ team members for your great team effort.

The game was great, the guys played really well. We were down early but hung on to come back. will have to watch defence for next game. Goalies played fantastic. Great to finally beat Hungary.

5-3 Loss

The team was a bit sluggish from yesterday but still played hard. Some old habits started creeping back in that cost us at times. Brazil controlled game well. We need to shoot the puck more. Team still upbeat and know we can do better

Whole team played very poorly today; very disappointing to lose like this. A lot of reverting back to old NZ style hockey. Australia played well but we helped them out to a large degree. Simple things not done properly i.e. shooting, positioning.

Told the team not to over analyse the game occause it was just one of those days. Try to remain positive and focus on the good results in the Hungary and Brazil matches.

The augs are disappointed but not down which is good we know we can play much better than this and have left ourselves the hard path to the final.

game four Vs Japan 5-4 Win

what a turnaround by the guys. Everyone did everything asked for by the coach; was amazing to be apart of such a turnaround and is great to beat Japan for the first time.

The team is stoked we will be playing off for a medal; we really want to beat Aus tomorrow and make the final.

game five vs Australia 7-3 Win



We out shot them 44 - 28 and our goalles played superoly. The team is just buzzing at the thought of playing off for a gold medal.

Final vs Brazil Fulltime 4-4 Overtime 5 - 4 Loss

Not much to say about this one: we were up 4 - 1 at half time and we should have won the game. Great to win the silver medal but when we should have had the gold, for me it's quite hard to swallow.

Apart from this it's the best an Australasian team has ever done at worlds. The team was fantastic; players, coaching and management. I think the experience the younger guys had in the world cup in the USA was priceless, for nine rookies to play that well is unbelievable. I really hope the majority of the squad and management will come back next year if the base of the team can stay together, and with a lot of hard work. I really believe in a few years we can challenge for promotion to the top division. The hard thing is getting seven or eight players to play in consecutive worlds.

I felt that Shane did an absolutely unbelievable job for the team. The management too was perfect: they were always there for the players and related well to every one too.


