- To give you a sense of belonging
- Make sure you have an adult who is always there for you
- Make sure you have a good education
- · Help you make good memories for the future
- Help you get ready for being an adult
- To support your interests and needs

We have made the 6 promises into a set of cards that are given to you by your Social Worker. They have been designed with the help of young people in care and are clear and easy to understand.

If you don't have a pack, just ask your Social Worker.

HOWLETTS WILDLIFE PARK



In the Summer holidays, we took a group of young people to the zoo. After a busy arrival we spilt into groups for a fun packed day seeing the animals. We slowly made our way around the park seeing all the different animals like dholes, ant eaters and the Pallas cat which we even got to see having a bite to eat! After about an hour, everyone wanted a pit stop for a snack, then it was back to touring the zoo! We stood and watched the gorillas for ages playing in their large enclosure, and we got to see a mother feeding its tiny baby, it was so cute! After that it was time for lunch and time in the play area. After we'd had a bite to eat and let off some steam, it was time to see some more animals. We then went and watched the elephant show, where a mum and a son elephant came to say hello and show off. After a little while it was time to make our way up the big hill and back to the entrance to collect our goody bags and go home.







BEWL WATER



In August we took some of you guys to Bewl Water, and what a great day it was! Once everyone arrived, we split into two groups, one to do canoeing first, while the other would go biking (and we would switch at lunch). During canoeing we were split up into three of us per canoe. At first there was a lot of spinning around... and more spinning as we were trying to figure out a rhythm to our rowing. It took some of us (Chelsea and Tom!) a little bit longer to get their boats going in a straight line than the others. That wasn't the best part though, we had to group our canoes together and tie them up, so we could then play a game of fruit salad! No one fell in... While the others were off on their ride, we had some people who had never ridden a bike before, and with just a little help to get started they were off and it was hard to keep up with them. So well done to you guys!



BETTESHANGER

On Wednesday 8th August, we took some of you guys to Betteshanger, and what a great day it was! After a very busy and loud arrival, we split into three groups. One group would do den building, another would do treasure hunting and the last group would do the dreaded obstacle course. During the treasure hunt, we were given little compasses that had coordinates set to the location that the treasure laid. We had to follow the path to get the prize. After lots and lots of running, and seeking, with help from Jo, we were able to find the item that was stuck behind a sign.

After a little snack break we went off again, changing activity. We went to den building which was really fun. We got different lengths of ropes and different logs and tied them in a special way to make the frame of the den. We then had to get the tarpaulin and place it over the den and tie it together, making the shelter.

After lunch, we had one more activity. This was the obstacle course. Some of you guys persuaded Robert to take part! In and out, up and down, round and over you guys went, through tunnels and over hurdles. Faster and faster the instructor was telling you to go. So, with that, we then had a go on the big obstacle course, in which some of you guys had really good fun on the rope swing. We had to catch a few of you as you came across to stop you falling in. There were some close calls but luckily there was only one splash. The obstacle course was difficult so well done everyone!







HUCKLEBERRY WOODS





Our day out for the under 7's was as Huckleberry Woods. The day started with a safety talk then a tour of Huckleberry. We saw lots of different animals like alpacas, miniature pigs, ducks, chickens and donkeys. We were also given some small buckets with different foods for the animals. After a feeding frenzy with all the chickens and alpacas we went to do pig fishing. This involves a piece of squash on a rod and then you hold it over the fence for the pigs to grab. Those little pigs can really pull hard, they even snapped the strings!

We then moved on to a treasure hunt which was really fun and led us all over the farm hunting for clues. When we reached the end we were surprised with a hoard of chocolate, it didn't last long! Huckleberry put a lovely spread on which included homemade sausage rolls, mini sandwiches, peppers with humus. After a slice of cake it was time to go meet the carers for home time.




