WEEKLY NOTICES AND REMINDERS

Kia ora Koutou,

Spring is here and the holidays are near! Spring symbolises new life, new beginnings and a change of season; so it is very timely that the Board are announcing the fruits of all the consultation and information gathering around our foundational statements (Vision, Mission and Values). Coming home today is an envelope containing a letter from the Board outlining and introducing the amended Vision, Mission and Core School Values. It also contains another level of consultation around the new Core Values. If you do not receive an envelope please contact the school so we can issue another one.

Over the next couple of weeks we will be running our school evacuation drills: Fire, Earthquake and Lock Down. As a result of the information gathered in the last drills, we have been trying to tighten up on knowing who is on site. We have, for weeks, asked that visitors to the school sign in and out. And parents

taking students off site, sign students out at the office. These are both important steps for the health and safety processes in the operation of the school. Due to a lack of response to these requests, we are forced to further



tighten up this process. All adults staying on site for more than pick up and drops offs or popping in with messages, etc. will be required to wear a visitor's badge (obtained when you sign in at the office). If you do not have one please do not be offended if a staff member asks you to go and get one. *Exclusions to this process are assemblies and syndicate or whole school events.*

Again a HUGE thank you to all the parents acting responsibly, respectfully and taking care of all our students and whanau in the pick up and drop off areas of the school. Please note, IT IS NOT OK TO STOP IN THE MIDDLE OF THE ROAD AND HAVE STUDENTS HOP IN THE CAR. This is still happening too often; it is not safe, adds to congestion and is setting a poor example to our students. If this continues to happen your child/ren will be required to sit in the kai area until the car is parked and you come in and get them.

On a far more positive note, the Ministry of Education has released our staffing entitlement for next year. We will be retaining our 9th classroom for the whole year again in 2018. If things go to plan, the 9th classroom will also receive a major internal overhaul and update prior to the beginning of the school year too!

Gymnastics. Cheerleading and Hip hop is on today at the Waihi Beach Community Centre - Good luck to you all.


