Introducing Sanette van Vollenstee

Sanette is a Social Worker in schools (SWiS). She can work alongside children and their families, teachers, RTLBs and community agencies to achieve positive outcomes for children currently in Years 1-8.

Examples of needs/concerns families might require support with...

- * Child's integration into a new school.
- * School attendance.
- * Helping children manage emotions and behavior.
- * Children and families experiencing grief, loss or trauma.
- * Family relationships, step parenting and blended families.
- * Behaviour/discipline concerns and parenting support.
- * Children and families experiencing health problems or a disability.
- * Children requiring skills to manage their classroom preparedness and personal property.

* Children and their families experiencing financial hardship, and lack of support or resources.
