Welcome back to Term 3.

We have had a very busy start to the term with all classes full steam ahead preparing for their Matariki Showcase. This show is very student focused and student run, so all classes have been busy with script practice (many scripts written by students!), prop preparation, costume creation and much more. We look forward to seeing you at one of the showcases next week.

A huge thank you to the parents that have been helping out with showcase preparation work and a bigger thank you to those that have remembered to sign in and out at the office.

This week we have been trialling a change in the order of our break time activities. We have been trialling sending the students out to play first then coming back to class (as opposed to the outdoor eating area) to eat at the end part of the breaks. With the introduction of a brain break (snack) in all classes at 10am, the time frame between eating has not changed. So far the students and staff love it, with many benefits coming from the change. For example, the ability to monitor students eating has become far more efficient and effective. Students having a calm space to talk over their feelings and happenings and teachers can deal with any incidents there and then. Less rubbish getting blown around the school, to name a few. We will continue trialling this change next week and if all continues to progress well will lock it in for the rest of the term.

We have collated the data from our second "Have your say" survey. The board will be putting together the wording for a Vision and Mission statement that reflects the data. We will be getting a group of parents together at school to have a look at the proposed wordings and feedback thoughts, opinions and understandings to us. If you are interested in being part of this working group (should take about an hour) let Sharon know to add you to the list and we will send out times and dates in the coming weeks.

Some may have noticed that our website has changed! This has been a project happening behind the scenes this year. There are still many aspects that are under construction and needing an update, however it is live and worth checking out. Key staff will be learning how to update and maintain the site in week 3.
