Learning focus

We have named the nursery class the Tui room and the preschool class the Pukeko room.

In Te Whāriki our curriculum talks about children's rights. The right to be, the right to become, the right to enjoy and the right to choose.

In the nursery (Tui room) we have been investigating these rights. An example of the 'Right to become' is we support children as they explore and discover who they are and what they are capable of eg freedom of movement, verbally supporting children as they reach physical milestones in their own time. There is a strong interest in different provocations such as sensory play, singing, books, and obstacle courses.

The tamariki have had a strong interest in nature, exploring our new 'wild' area with plants and long grass. Teachers have recently attended two different professional development courses about the benefits of learning in nature. We are excited to watch our new sweet pea teepee begin to grow.



The children in the preschool (Pukeko room) have just finished 10 fun sessions of Jump Rope with students visiting from Otago Polytech. This has been great to challenge the tamariki to extend on their risk taking, following instructions, balance and coordination.

We have been promoting our bicultural values recently of Manaakitanga, showing kindness, respect, Ako, teacher/learner, Whanaungatanga, building relationships, teamwork and Tuakana-teina, older/younger relationship building.

We celebrated Diwali by making lanterns, dressing in colourful clothing and learning a little about the event such as decorating the doorways with patterns.

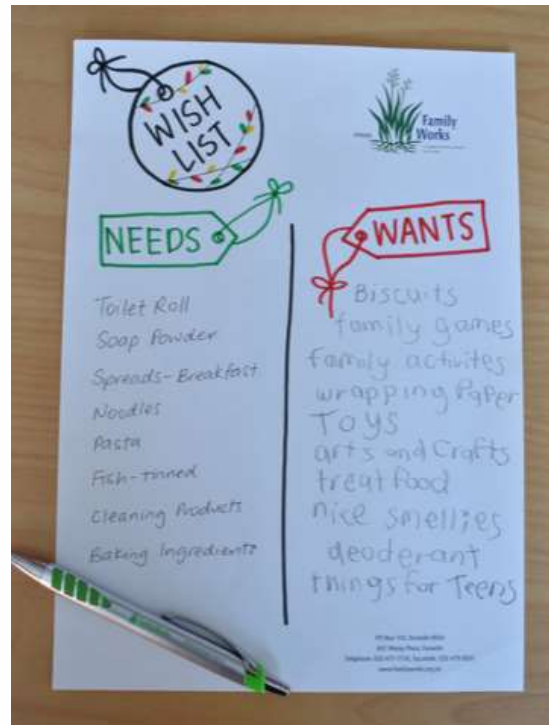
Regular outings are happening for the older preschool group of children. The focus has been on greeting members of the community, using manners and following instructions.
