One: Jesus Christ is the Light of the World

All: **A light no darkness can extinguish**

As the Christ Candle is lit we say together—Phos Hilaron—O gracious light
O gracious light, pure brightness of the Gracious God in heaven,
O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed!

Now as we come to the setting of the sun,
and our eyes behold the vesper light,
we sing your praises, O God: Creator, Redeemer, Sustainer.
You are worthy at all times to be sung by happy voices,
O Son of God, O Giver of life, and to be glorified through all the
worlds.

One: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Lighting of the Advent Candles (Hope, Peace, Joy)

1st Voice: We light these candles in thanksgiving for loved ones lost,
for past health and joy that now seems distant.

2nd Voice: We light these candles in prayer, that we will feel God's love
even though at this time we may feel sorrow.

3rd Voice: We light these candles in hope, for the promises of God yet
to be revealed.

All: **Amen.**

One: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe,
Creator of light and darkness.

In this holy season, when the sun's light is swallowed up
by the growing darkness of the night, you renew your promise
to reveal among us the splendour of your glory, enfleshed and
visible to us in Jesus Christ, your Son. Through the prophets you

teach us to hope for his reign of peace. Through the outpouring of his Spirit, you open our blindness to the glory of his presence. Strengthen us in our weakness. Support us in our often stumbling efforts to do your will and free our tongues to sing your praise. For to you all honour and blessing are due, now and for ever.

◆ PROCLAMATION of the WORD ◆

The First Lesson

A Reading from the Book of Isaiah: 9: 2-7a

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness – on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire. For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onwards and for evermore.

One: The Word of God.

The Second Lesson:

A Reading from the Gospel according to John: 1: 1-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was

not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of the father's only begotten son, full of grace and truth.

All: Thanks be to God.

◆ LIGHTING OF CANDLES ◆

A Prayer for All Souls

All: Creator of all, we pray to you for those whom we love, but see no longer. Grant them your peace, let light perpetual shine upon them, and in your loving wisdom and almighty power, work in them the good purpose of your perfect will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Those who wish to do so are invited to light a candle: the candle may be lit to remember a loved one, to symbolize a prayer offered for one's self or others, to offer a prayer for the healing of the world. You are invited to come forward to light the candles using the light from the Christ Candle.
