#### **♦** Worship Next Week **♦**

In preparation for the celebrations in late March that will honour the completion of our Melrose church building (designed by Scottish architect J. Gibb Morton), each Sunday over the next few weeks we will feature themes drawn from one of our beautiful stained glass windows. Next week, the featured window will be the first on the north aisle in which artist Peter Haworth depicts the sojourn of Abraham and Sarah, who are called to leave behind everything that was familiar to them and to depart for a new life in an unknown land that God will provide (Genesis 12: 1-7). God's promise to Abraham involves not only the supplying of land to a landless people (and protection along their journey to that new land), it also involves the offer of offspring to an aging, barren couple. God promises that Abraham will be the father of a great nation. Abraham responds to the promises of God with unwavering faith. The theme of the journey will become central to Israel's identity (further revealed in the companion window depicting Moses and the Exodus from Egypt). In larger thematic terms, the nomadic motif of movement through space further becomes symbolic of openness toward the future. The excitement of departing on a journey holds within itself optimism about the new possibilities that the future may bring.

## ◆ Celebrating our stained glass windows in Worship ◆

2019 marks the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the completion of our beautiful sanctuary designed by renowned Scottish architect John Gibb Morton, who used the ruin of Melrose Abbey as his creative inspiration – hence our church name. In honour of the anniversary, and in anticipation of our forthcoming celebration weekend in late March, elements of worship on each of the forthcoming Sundays will feature themes from one of the glorious stained glass windows that adorn the sanctuary walls. We begin this week with the Creation window of the South Transept.

## **♦** Next Steps: Congregational Survey **♦**

As you know, the United Church of Canada (UCC) is undergoing significant restructuring effective January 1st, with changes to many of its processes. We have now been able to clarify some important aspects related to moving out of Interim Ministry, which will occur at the end of June, 2019. As part of the UCC's new pastoral relations process, what was formerly a Joint Needs Assessment Committee (JNAC) report is replaced by a Community of Faith profile. Responsibility for this lies with "the governing body of the

community of faith", which in the case of Melrose is the Official Board. The Board understands that key to developing that profile is broad consultation with the congregation regarding our future direction and what we are looking for in a search process. To that end, the Official Board strongly encourages all who are connected to Melrose to provide us with input and complete a congregational survey. This survey will be able to be completed electronically and returned to the church office via email, or in paper format and either mailed to the office or returned to a survey drop box which will be located in the auditorium.

The survey will be available starting Sunday, December 23rd, and the deadline for response is **TODAY January 20th**. In addition, there will be opportunities for "fireside chats" with the Board after the church service on January 20th and 27th.
