♦ Worship Next Week ♦

Next week is the First Sunday in Lent. We will be celebrating Communion today. Our journey during this Holy Season leads us through peaks and valleys of Hope, Despair and ultimately Hope once again. It is a time for examining and reawakening our relationship with God.

Traditionally, it has been a time of giving up something we like as a way of focusing us on our spiritual life. Some have chosen to take on something new as a way of honouring God. Perhaps, you choose daily prayer, or meditation, or an intentional act of social justice, whatever your path, it is your personal expression and gift to our loving Creator who chose to become One of us in the incarnated Jesus.

This walk is familiar and we know the outcome, yet it offers us an opportunity to see with fresh eyes the Holy Mystery that brings us to the foot of the Cross and Beyond.

Our Scriptures start at the beginning with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden facing the temptation to which they succumb. It is not just surreptitiously scoffing an apple off a tree that is at stake. The heart of the error in judgment begins in disobedience and the desire to be equal with God in powerful all-knowing. Sin enters the world in the form of a break in the relationship and trust in our benefactor, God. It forms the pattern for generations of disquiet in choices that fall short of humanity glorifying God.

Our Gospel picks up the narrative of Jesus similarly being tempted in the wilderness by Satan. In spite of offers of food, rescue and power, Jesus remains steadfast in his resolve to worship the One true God.

My reflections this week look at both these scriptures from a point of weakness versus resolve, disobedience versus obedience, and fall versus grace. May you find new moments of insight and a deeper relationship with God as you reflect on what it means to be a disciple in the service of Jesus Christ.
