♦ Worship Next Week ◆

In February, I have decided to change the presentation of scripture by using all three recommended scriptures from the lectionary reading plus the psalms. Rather than one main sermon, my reflections are being split to cover two scriptures rather than one. The first reflection will occur right after the reading as the chosen text and the second after the text of the Gospel. This will allow two different insights to be explored and shared.

The first Scripture from 1 Corinthians 2:1-12 involves Paul lecturing the Church of Corinth on human wisdom versus the mysterious wisdom of God. If we follow the world's view of power, we cease to be the church, and we are only mimics of the

political power to which we have grown so accustomed. When we believe that our knowledge will lead us to the truth which we can control and manage, we lose sight of the gospel which is revealed in weakness and vulnerability of the love of God in Jesus on the cross.

In the Gospel of Matthew, we are continuing with the Sermon on the Mount – Jesus' teachings began with the Beatitudes discussed last week. This week he teaches about obedience to God's laws and offers the two metaphors of salt that retains its flavor, and light that is allowed to shine, to describe the importance of his followers when they follow his teachings. This is the fifth Sunday after Epiphany and we are travelling along with Jesus as he lays out the instructions for discipleship.

Has anyone browsed the Gifts with Vision catalogue or the online site from United Church of Canada? It is worth a visit to understand how the United Church of Canada supports local, national and international needs.



GWV19-5

\$35.00 donation assists Safe Spaces for Youth in Jamacia and Kenya where young people because of the gender identity, sexual orientation and gender expression face violence and rejection by their own families and society. Youth are provided with health care, counselling and job training and a safe accommodation.

GWV19-23

\$130.00 donation supports farmers in rural Colombia (often women) in obtaining microloans and learn about crop rotation, fertilizers and irrigation. This improves yields and thusly improves the security of families.


