♦ Worship Next Week ◆

Next week is the Third Sunday in Lent. And the Israelites are on their journey through the wilderness, their Exodus from exile and slavery. They are tired, frustrated, dusty and thirsty. They are an unhappy lot, complaining and quarrelsome, as most likely we would be too under the same circumstances. Moses is fed up with them and asks God to intervene.

The same staff that Moses held up to part the Red Sea is called into action once more, this time to strike a rock. God calls forth fresh spring water to quench their thirst and remind them that their God is still amongst them and cares about their comfort.

John's Scripture for today ties in the theme of water. A Samaritan woman (not favoured by the Jews) comes to a well to draw water and encounters "the living water" in Jesus Christ. This is a familiar passage that serves to open up a number of limitations between the Jewish people and those on whose land they cross – religious, social, political and gender. As she converses with him,

she ponders, Could this be the Christ? In retelling her conversation with Jesus she becomes the first Gentile witness to her whole town. This encourages us to be aware that Jesus meets each of us right where we are.
