The Words of Institution and Prayer for the Spirit

One: We give you thanks, Holy God, for Jesus
who came to be Your living Word,
to baptize us with Spirit and fire,
to feed the hungry, to humble the mighty,
and to announce the good news of your coming realm.
With thanksgiving, we remember how, when the hour had
come, Jesus took his place at the table with his friends.

Then Jesus took bread and when he had given thanks,
He broke it and gave it to them saying,
"This is my body which is given for you;

"This cup that is poured out for you

The **light coloured** chalices contain **grape juice**, the **dark green** chalices contain **wine**. If you are unable to come forward, the servers will gladly come and serve you in the pew. Please help them to locate you.)*
