#### ◆ Worship Next Week ◆

In the concluding line of each verse of Ron Klusmeier's 1977 hymn "Worship the Lord" we are reminded that "worship and work must be one." Klusmeier's text underscores the true meaning of the word "liturgy" which is "the work of the people." Appropriately next week we will combine our morning worship with our AGM which will take place in the auditorium following our time in the sanctuary (if you are planning to attend the AGM, remember to bring something for your lunch!). The homily will also explore the nature of this important connection between worship and work. It will focus on the calling of Isaiah the prophet which is described in beautiful detail in the Book of Isaiah's sixth chapter. Standing in the holy sanctuary of the Jerusalem temple, the prophet has a vision of the Divine Presence. Isaiah realizes that God is so large that hem of God's robe entirely fills the temple space. Faced with ultimate majesty, the prophet is brought to a realization about his own smallness. He becomes aware that he has "unclean lips" and that he needs to be purified by another agent; in this case, a seraph who touches his mouth with a coal from the altar. Once forgiven and cleansed, the prophet asks to be sent out into the world in response to God's holy call. The pattern of Isaiah's experience reflects what congregations do when they worship together. We honour God and God's power, we seek blessing and forgiveness and we offer the gift of ourselves and our lives in the divine project of mending a broken world. Worship and work must be one.

#### ◆ A Time for Reconciliation and Forgiveness ◆

Wednesday, February 20, 7:30 pm. When the Transition Team presented its report to the congregation this past October, the Team acknowledged that there was still some work to do on the first of the stated goals for the period of interim ministry: Helping to bring healing to the congregation. Conflict, as we know, can be destructive in any congregation or organization. Even once many aspects of conflict have been dealt with it is not quite enough to leave it at that, especially when such conflict involved the end of a pastoral relationship. Healing – deep healing – needs to draw on spiritual resources as well. The Transition Team will provide an opportunity for such healing on the evening of February 20th. This time of sharing will be excellently facilitated by Judith Johnson, a former Minister of Congregational Development for Hamilton Conference. The intention is both to provide a safe context for all voices to be heard and also to encourage the kind of reconciliation and forgiveness that will, in turn, provide a healthy foundation for developing a new pastoral relationship here at Melrose.
