

♦ Worship Next Week ◆

This coming Wednesday, March 6th is Ash Wednesday. The Time for Healing and Reconciliation which was postponed from February 20th will take place (weather permitting!) on this day at 7:30 pm. March 10th is the first Sunday of Lent (it's also time change Sunday so don't forget to spring forward!). As is our custom, we will mark the beginning of this new season of the church year with the celebration of Holy Communion. The communion homily will focus on the Temptation sequence in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 4: 1-13). Luke tells us that immediately following his baptism, Jesus goes into the wilderness. He had said "yes" to God in baptism, but in order to enter into his vocation he needed to learn to say "no" to the temptations with which Satan attempts to seduce him. All three of these tests tempt Jesus both to betray his identity and to misuse his power. The first temptation is to make the gratification of one's physical appetites the priority in life. The second is to gain influence and followers by flashy displays of power. The third temptation is to gain wealth, possessions and political control by an idolatrous use of power. Jesus says "no" to all three by quoting Deuteronomy 6:13 which requires the worship of God alone.

These disasters also destroyed vital transportation and communication links making emergency response challenging.

In the midst of this, United Church Mission & Service partner ACT Alliance, working with other partners in the region, is responding to these devastating events with medical teams to treat the injured, damage assessment teams, food, shelter, and agricultural support to replant crops. They are concentrating their resources to reach the most remote and underserved communities. United Church donations will support this critical work.

Please include the people of the Asia Pacific Region in your prayers as they face the long and difficult journey from emergency response to reconstruction and recovery.


