On January 6, 2019, the Nativity narrative continues as we mark the Feast of the Epiphany (Twelfth Night) and celebrate through song, story and sacrament the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus. In the Greek language and "epiphany" is a "manifestation" or "sudden awareness." The Magi were the first to recognize that the reign of love inaugurated by Jesus' birth would extend beyond Palestine to the whole world. One of the lovely European traditions associated with the day of Epiphany is marking the lintels of doorways with chalk and saying a blessing: "Peace be with this house and all who live here. And peace be with all who enter here." Wouldn't it be excellent if peace broke out in our world during 2019!
