PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION:

One: Holy God. Open to us the wonder and meaning of your Scriptures so that we may ponder them and find new ways to understand them in our own personal context.

WISDOM OF ISRAEL: Exodus 14:10 – 31 and 15:20-21 As Pharaoh drew near, the Israelites looked back, and there were the Egyptians advancing on them. In great fear the Israelites cried out to the LORD. They said to Moses, "Was it because there were no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us, bringing us out of Egypt? Is this not the very thing we told you in Egypt, 'Let us alone and let us serve the Egyptians'? For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness." But Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the LORD will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today you shall

never see again. The LORD will fight for you, and you have only to keep still."

Then the LORD said to Moses, "Why do you cry out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. But you lift up your staff, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the Israelites may go into the sea on dry ground. Then I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them; and so I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army, his chariots, and his chariot drivers. And the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I have gained glory for myself over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his chariot drivers." The angel of God who was going before the Israelite army moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from in front of them and took its place behind them. It came between the army of Egypt and the army of Israel. And so the cloud was there with the darkness, and it lit up the night; one did not come near the other all night.

Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The LORD drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and turned the sea into dry land; and the waters were divided. The Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. The Egyptians pursued, and went into the sea after them, all of Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and chariot drivers. At the morning watch the LORD in the pillar of fire and cloud looked down upon the Egyptian army, and threw the Egyptian army into panic. He clogged their chariot wheels so that they turned with difficulty. The Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the Israelites, for the LORD is fighting for them against Egypt." Then the LORD said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, so that the water may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots and chariot drivers." So Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at dawn the sea returned

to its normal depth. As the Egyptians fled before it, the LORD tossed the Egyptians into the sea. The waters returned and covered the chariots and the chariot drivers, the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea; not one of them remained. But the Israelites walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. Thus the LORD saved Israel that day from the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. Israel saw the great work that the LORD did against the Egyptians. So the people feared the LORD and believed in the LORD and in his servant Moses. Then the prophet Miriam, Aaron's sister, took a tambourine in her hand; and all the women went out after her with tambourines and with dancing. And Miriam sang to them: "Sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously; horse and rider he has thrown into the sea."

One: This is the word of the Lord

All: Thanks be to God.

THE GOSPEL: Matthew 28:1-10

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." So they left

the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

One: This is the good news of our Lord, Jesus Christ!

All: Praise to you, O Christ.

REFLECTION: Dejected Disciples! Tim LaHaye and Jerry B Jenkins are authors of The Jesus Chronicles, a novel about Matthew's Story. These ideas and excerpts are taken from it.

Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were majorly confused when they confronted the empty tomb. It was the morning of the third day following the horrific crucifixion and the end of their dreams of being part of Jesus' glorious kingdom. They took their news to the rest of the disciples who had gathered for safety in the upper room.

Matthew had no idea what was in store for him. He was grieving deeply over the loss of His Lord, as were all the disciples. They were awaiting the return of the two Mary's, believing that their trip to the tomb to tend to the Lord's body would be in vain. Pilate had ensured that the Roman guards kept watch to prevent any of Jesus followers from stealing and moving his body.

Matthew rose reluctantly from his sleep. He had intended to go with the women to the tomb but they left much earlier. He headed for the kitchen where there was fresh bread baking. He felt a pang of sadness as he remembered the last meal, the breaking of the bread. He thought of how direct Jesus could be. It was this very

directness his honesty and his probing truth that had gotten him killed. Matthew woke the others and they joined him for breakfast. They had nearly finished eating when they heard what sounded like thunder in the distance and the whole place was shaken. An earthquake one said.

It was only a few minutes later they hear excited voices approaching and footsteps on the stairs. The two Marys swept in both talking at once. "We heard an earthquake" the men said. "We know" the women said. "An angel of the Lord rolled back the stone from the tomb and sat on it. He was as white as snow." "What of the Roman guards" the men said. "They fainted from fear" one of the Marys said. Mary Magdalene said "the angel told us" "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he is risen, as He said." "That's crazy." "I don't believe it." "You're dreaming." came the spontaneous replies. "No the angel told us to go quickly and tell you. On our way here Jesus met us saying "Rejoice." "He told us to tell you to go to a mount in Galilee and there you would believe what we are telling you."

Matthew wanted so badly to believe them. The women wouldn't lie, would they? But, he like the others had to see for themselves. He grabbed his coat and they all headed off hardly daring to hope that it could be true.

I'll believe it when I see it Thomas muttered. And who could blame him!

For all those that we hold in our hearts we raise up to you for their safe keeping. (Quiet reflection) All: Our Father, who art in heaven,
